#### Develop skills to work with clients experiencing a mental health illness

This qualification focuses on the **support and needs of people** experiencing mental health issues. You'll learn about the value and principles of the mental health sector and how to apply them in a recovery oriented way.

You will undertake a supervised or simulated **work placement\*** where you will be able to apply the skills and knowledge you have learned.

You could find work in a variety of community contexts such as community based non-government organisations; outreach; centre-based programs; respite care; residential services; rehabilitation programs; clinical settings; or supporting people in employment.

This course will be delivered through a **combination of online and on campus** training. The **online delivery will be done via Collaborate sessions** (on Blackboard), which are **live classes facilitated by a lecturer**. The majority of the training will be delivered via on campus sessions. Class attendance is required for successful completion of the course.

## **Employer-based delivery mode information**

Employer-based training offers a flexible, self-paced study program which combines workplace recognition of prior learning and individualised 'gap' training to attain your qualification.

You must already be employed in a job role related to your course of study for more than 25 hours week and have at least 6 - 12 months experience in order to qualify for employer/work based mode of delivery.

This means every time you go to work you are learning and demonstrating competence whilst working towards your qualification. The flexibility of Employer-based training allows you to structure and perform learning and assessment in a way that fits into your professional and personal life.

Learning and assessment plans are created on an individual level in consultation with you and/or your employer. Assessment is conducted using numerous methods including practical demonstration and observation, question and answer interviews, written tasks, supervisor reports and workshops.

# **Entrance requirements**

If this course is deemed competitive, you will be informed during your application via <u>TAFE Admissions</u> and additional entrance requirements will apply.

## **Timetable**

#### On campus - Combined delivery

All classes (Collaborate and on campus sessions) run between 9:00am - 3:45pm up to 3 days a week over 12 months.

Class attendance is required for successful completion of the course.

All on campus Community Service qualifications are offered through a **combined delivery** approach, where we make use of both face to face on-campus practical/theory and assessment classes, as well as online/Collaborate (Blackboard) sessions.

Approximately 80% of theory and assessment is face to face, and the remaining 20% via online/Collaborate using our online learning management system Blackboard.

Collaborate sessions, are a live class run online led by a lecturer, via Blackboard, our online learning management system. Collaborate sessions require access to a computer and Wi-Fi; and a set of headphones is recommended. If you do not have your own device or Wi-Fi, you can access the computers in the library on your campus, local libraries and of course Wi-Fi anywhere on campus. The library also has a limited number of devices that students can borrow.

## **Work placement**

\* Only certain units have a work placement attached to them, and students must demonstrate satisfactory progress in these units in order to be offered a work placement.

Eligibility for supervised work placement is subject to obtaining a satisfactory **Police Clearance**. You will also need a **Working with Children Check** if your placement involves contact with children. **Applications for these are not included as part of your course and will incur additional costs.** 

Please be aware that COVID-19 vaccination is an employment requirement for many healthcare providers. NMTAFE students undertaking work placements or who are required to attend a healthcare or community setting as part of their studies are advised to check directly with the healthcare provider regarding their policy settings around vaccination and proof of vaccination requirements.
