



CUA20715 Certificate II in Visual Arts

Suitable for people with a disability, and/or mental health conditions

Duration

The units of this course are delivered in two groups, Drawing and Mixed Media, and Ceramics and Sculpture. Each group of units will take one semester (6 months) to complete. Both groups of units will be offered in each semester and students will attend the Leederville campus, two days per week, for the semester.

If a student successfully completes both groups of units they will be eligible for a Certificate II of Visual Art.

Description

Students will develop art skills such as:

- **Drawing**, from the fundamentals to a range of techniques using mixed media.
- **Digital art**, including basic photography and manipulating digital images.
- Creating **ceramic artworks** for the garden.
- Creating **sculptures** using recycled materials and learning how to work in 3D.
