

General Education for Adults - Maths & Numeracy

For people with an intellectual or learning disability

There are 2 levels of maths skill sets. The student's level is determined during their interview and initial assessment, or, by progressing through the skill sets.

Duration

Students will attend the Leederville campus for a two hour class each week, for one semester. They can then enrol in the Semester 2 units, also a two hour class each week for one semester.

Mid-year enrolment may be available for new students, after an interview and assessment, if there are vacancies in the class.

If a student does not successfully complete a skill set within two semesters but has demonstrated a progression in the development of their skills, they may be invited to re-enrol into the skill set for a second time.

Description

These skill sets specifically focus on maths skills which develop independence to participate in life, work and community living. They cover a variety of maths skills used in everyday life.

Students who are nonverbal or hearing impaired will need to be supported by an ASL interpreter or support worker.

Students will need to enrol each semester.

Entrance requirements

All prospective students must:

- Demonstrate behaviour appropriate to an adult learning environment and be able to work in a group setting.
- Identify a goal or goals that the program will help them to achieve and show a willingness to learn.
- Be able to read and write at a basic level.

Please note that due to limited class sizes, meeting entrance requirements and attending an interview does not guarantee applicants a place.

Unique Student Identifier (USI)

All prospective students must have a USI before they can enrol in any course at North Metropolitan TAFE. A USI is available from the following Government website and is free www.usi.gov.au. Students coming straight from school should already have a USI.

Applicants need to bring this number to their interview.

How to apply

Selection is by interview, which may also include an academic assessment.

Interviews for classes and courses starting in February 2021 will take place in D Block Leederville campus from Tuesday 1 December to Tuesday 8 December 2020.

All interviews are booked online via the North Metropolitan TAFE website.
