Keys for Life - for people with an intellectual or learning disability

Duration

Students will attend Leederville campus for a two hour session, once per week, for one semester.

If the student gets their Keys for Life certificate prior to finishing the course, they do not need to continue. Similarly, if the student needs more time they can continue for another semester.

Description

This course assists students to become familiar with the information in the Drive Safe Handbook, leading to knowledge to gain their Learners Permit. Students who successfully complete the course will gain the Keys for Life Certificate enabling them to bypass sitting the Learners Permit test at a licencing centre. The following conditions apply:

Students must (at the time of applying for their permit):

- Be 16 years of age or older
- Present 5 forms of identity
- Pass an eyesight test
- Declare any medical conditions and be cleared by their GP to drive
- Pay the prescribed fees to obtain permit and logbook

Entrance requirements

Students must:

- Demonstrate behaviour appropriate to an adult learning environment and be able to work in a group setting.
- Be able to access the internet and use a computer competently.
- Be able to read and write at an appropriate level e.g. be able to read community and road signs independently.
- Identify practical and realistic goals that the program will help them achieve and show a willingness to learn
- Have a method of exchanging information with others

Please note that due to limited class sizes, meeting entrance requirements does not guarantee applicants a place in this course.
