



Certificate II in Information, Digital Media & Technology

ICT20115 | For people with an intellectual or learning disability

Duration

This is a part-time course delivered as two skill sets over two years and students will attend Leederville Campus for two days per week.

Description

The Certificate II in Information, Digital Media and Technology is a vocational course developed specifically to provide students with intellectual or learning disabilities with the digital literacy skills needed to access and maintain employment in a wide variety of industries.

Additional support is provided in the form of smaller class sizes plus additional time to complete the qualification and specialist staff that are skilled to deal with students that have a disability.

Entrance requirements

Students must:

- Be personally motivated to attend and actively participate with other students in the class.
- Demonstrate behaviour appropriate to an adult learning environment.
- Have sufficient literacy and numeracy skills to cope with course content and workplace requirements.
