Duration

The Computers for Life and Living classes run for two hours per week, for one year. All classes are run at Leederville campus.

Description

This course builds on skills developed in Introduction to Computers. Students will be using Microsoft Word and PowerPoint, and the internet.

Students skills will be developed so that they can use a personal computer as a tool for further learning.

Entrance requirements

Students must:

- Be personally motivated to attend and actively participate with other students in the class.
- Demonstrate behaviour appropriate to the adult learning environment.
- Have at least Level 4 language and literacy skills to realistically achieve the course outcomes.
